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Who are the Allied Partners?

The Allied Partners are people of faith who share a vision of a strong healthy community in the Allied-Dunn's Marsh neighborhood. We work with members of the neighborhood as well as with service providers already involved in the community to support the neighborhood's physical and economic health, sustainability and the common good.

Faith in Action

Allied Partners support a number of projects in the Allied-Dunn's Marsh neighborhood. Our support is both financial and through volunteerism. Support comes from member congregations, donations from individuals including Allied area neighbors, and non-member communities of faith.

Projects Supported by Allied Partners:

The Food Pantry

Operating out of the Boys and Girls Club Family Center on Jenewein Rd provides

emergency food to families who are having a hard time making ends meet. The pantry is staffed by congregational and neighborhood volunteers.

The Allied Wellness Center

A holistic program which focuses on physical, emotional, spiritual and financial wellbeing. The Center offers health assessments, education, referral and health advocacy. Health promotion programs are offered throughout the year that includes exercise, support groups, and community building activities.

Allied Dunn's Marsh Neighborhood Association

The mission of ADMNA is to organize and participate in activities which will maintain the neighborhood's quality of life, ensure safety, preserve affordable housing and encourage residents to be involved in neighborhood activities. One of our goals is to offer ongoing methods to create shared understanding

of neighborhood assets, problems and solutions to build on strengths of the residents. Some of our ongoing activities are organizing monthly community meals along with educational programs.

The Eviction Prevention Fund

Assists families in keeping their homes when the family income is disrupted by sudden emergency such as sickness, unemployment, or death in the family. Requests for assistance are screened by the Joining Forces for Families social worker.

The Special Projects Fund

Works with the Allied-Dunn's Marsh neighborhood Association and other organizations to meet special needs that might arise in this culturally diverse neighborhood. The fund has assisted with transportation to employment, community events and occasional emergency situations.
